

## Challenger Deep - A Sport's Watch for Men

*Elegant and sporty*

*An elegant sport's watch. Water resistant to 300 metres, robust and technical.*

The "Challenger Deep", at a depth of 10,916 m, is the deepest known point under the ocean's surface. On 23 January 1960, Swiss explorer, Jacques Piccard and U.S. Navy Lieutenant Don Walsh, at the controls of the "Trieste" bathyscaphe, were the first to reach Challenger Deep. To commemorate this spectacular achievement, Emile Chouriet presents its first sport's watch, the "Challenger Deep".

This timepiece perfectly combines function and aesthetics. Its reliability and accuracy are guaranteed to a depth of 300 metres. Steel or ceramic, the rotating bezel is available in a black or blue version. Its ceramic coating gives it a precious stone appearance. The use of luminescent material on the dial produces green readability in a dark environment. The Emile Chouriet Challenger Deep watch upholds the DNA of the brand, with double wing-shaped horns that underline its virile appearance, while maintaining its noble character. Its sports function and masculine style combine for everyday use.
